Night works

Due to the complex nature of the project, some construction activities will need to be carried out at night and on weekends to minimise disruption to major roads, public transport and other critical services. We will notify local businesses and residents when we are planning activities outside our normal working hours.

Will it be noisy?

Some of the main sources of noise during construction include machinery, such as excavators, trucks delivering materials and transferring materials around the construction site, generators, lighting towers and reversing beepers on mobile equipment. Noise on the construction site will vary depending on the activities being undertaken at any given time.

To minimise the impact of our work on the surrounding community, the M41 Merri Creek to MCG Main Water Main Renewal Project team will:

- Schedule noisy activities within normal working hours wherever possible (7am to 6pm Monday to Friday and Saturday 7am to 1pm)
- Carry out regular checks on equipment to ensure it is running smoothly and efficiently
- Where possible, use broadband reversing alarms on construction vehicles and equipment. These alarms are much quieter than the standard reversing beepers used on most construction sites
- Where practicable, arrange loading activities to avoid reversing, reducing the use of reversing beepers
- Noise monitoring will be undertaken during night works to ensure the project is aware of the noise levels being generated by the various construction activities and where practicable, implement measures to minimise impact on residents as much as possible.

Lighting

Working at night will require the use of light towers to ensure a safe work environment. The project will direct lighting away from residential properties where possible.
